General Meeting Notes & Announcements:

Craig Doty, Lt. Governor, opened the meeting at 7:00 PM. Nicky Beedle from the Sammamish Club led the songs and pledge of allegiance. Evan Shultz, from the Crossroads Club, gave the invocation.

Craig recognized the Past Lt. Governors in attendance; Matt Gregory, Ferrin Lauve, Ken Ormiston and Carol Mahoney. He again announced that on March 11th, the Region 4 Conference will be held at the AM Vets Post #1 Building in Tacoma. The cost is \$35 each by the early deadline of March 1st. Craig also announced that the Key Club would be holding its DCON from 3/31 to 4/2/17.

Mat Gregory, candidate for District Governor-Elect, presented his program on the Division 28 website. He made a Power Point presentation highlighting some of the best features of the site. Club Reports

Bellevue – Bellevue participated in feeding programs at Highland Community Center and worked in Eastside Baby Corner. They will be going to Paddy Coyne Irish Pub on 2/21 to drink beer and play trivia for \$2/person. They will be participating in HopeFest on 3/25 from 11:30 to 3 PM at Highland Community Center and then in the evening having Casino night in the same location to play poker, blackjack and eat for \$65/person or \$120/couple. They are planning to attend an AquaSox game in Everett on Sunday, 7/30/17.

Crossroads - We continue our monthly feeding program for Jubilee Reach

Issaquah – The Issaquah Kiwanis Club will be doing the Boots, Barrels and Brews event this year, after all, at Pickering Barn on Friday night from 6:30 to 10:30 PM on May 12th. There will be food, line dancing and a raffle. The Whiskey Girls from Fall City will be teaching us how to line dance. Tickets are \$35 each. There will be an all access Play Day at Lake Sammamish Park on 3/1 and 3/32 from 3 to 5 PM. Physical Therapists will be available. The Club will prepare Kiwanis Trauma Dolls on Wednesday, May 22nd from 5:30 to 8 PM in Gibson Hall. We spent \$8,000 for the Key Club DCON that will be held in Portland. Issaquah High School is sending 24 Key Club delegates and Liberty High School is sending 21 Key Club delegates. We continue to provide food from the grocery stores to the Issaquah Food Bank on a weekly basis.

Issaquah Valley – The club will participate in the IHOP all day Pancake Day from 6 AM to closing on Tuesday, March 7th. Proceeds go to Children’s Hospital in Seattle. The club’s selling items on EBay.

Kirkland – The Club held its 12th meeting at the Market Street Restaurant on the corner of 18th and Market Street in Kirkland today. International Trustee, Art Riley, was in attendance. He is running for the International VP spot. The Club prepared 950 sandwiches for the Special Olympics. Our Key Clubs are providing delegates to DCON in Portland this year. Kirkland Sunrisers – On Thursday, February 16th we had a Diabetes expert talk at our meeting. We went to Hockey night for \$105 (\$55 for the event and \$50 for the auction basket) on January 29th in the Heritage Room at the ShoWare Hockey Rink in Kent.. 15 members attended. 11 Key Clubbers from the STEM High School will be attending DCON. Two of the Key Clubbers will be supported by the Kirkland Sunrisers. Carol will chaperone. We will be having the second annual Kentucky Derby event on Saturday, May 6th at Flycaster Brewery with food and a raffle. Finally, we got \$136 from Elavon which went to our Admin. Account. The credit card processing for the Kirkland Sunrisers Club is a fundraiser for our club’s Admin fund which involves processing credit card payments made to our club’s business owners from their clients through Elavon, which is a product from US Bank. Our club’s Admin fund gets a percentage of each of those credit card transactions.

Mercer Island – We are continuing to support our “growing” K-kids programs, Flags program, Preschool program, Eastside Baby Corner and selling Fireworks. Carol recently took over as Treasurer and got the donations to KCCP, Sign and Eliminate straightened out. Carol joined the VFW to store the flags.

Northshore/Bothell – No Report.

Providence Point – We had 8 members and 2 former members attend the Habitat for Humanity Interfaith Service last Sunday. We also gave them a \$1,000 check with liberal pictures taken and shared with H4H for their and our promotion efforts. We provided instruction to our members on the use of our website. We will provide a street side banner for Habitat for Humanity from Kiwanis to show our support. We had 5 members attend the Blue and Gold Banquet for Cub Scout Pack 225 on Feb. 8th at Creekside Elementary. We are planning to implement the New member packet and Newsletter this month.

Redmond – We prepared and served monthly meals for Jubilee Reach, Friends of Youth at the Landing, Avondale Park and fed 45 homeless people at Redmond United Methodist Church. Last month we added five new members and are still having our membership prospect meeting on March 10th.
